Westminster Confession of Faith 2:1

There is but one only,¹ living, and true God,² who is infinite in being and perfection,³ a most pure spirit,⁴ invisible,⁵ without body parts,⁶ or passions;⁷ immutable,⁸ immense,⁹ eternal,¹⁰ incomprehensible,¹¹ almighty,¹² most wise,¹³ most holy,¹⁴ most free,¹⁵ most absolute,¹⁶ working all things according to the counsel of his own immutable and most righteous will,¹⁷ for his own glory;¹⁸ most loving,¹⁹ gracious, merciful, long-suffering, abundant in goodness and truth, forgiving iniquity, transgression, and sin;²⁰ the rewarder of them that diligently seek him;²¹ additionally, most just, and correct in his judgments,²² hating all sin,²³ and who will by no means clear the guilty.²⁴

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The Many Seasons of Life in the Psalms

We may worship Jesus in the Psalms by meditating on when and how He sang them. As you sing the psalms of praise, think of how Jesus used the same psalms to praise his heavenly Father (Ps 8, 24, 29, 33, 47, 48). Think of how mournfully he sang the psalms of lament as he saw the impact of sin on himself, the church, and the community (Ps 38, 51, 86, 120); how anxiously he sang the psalms of suffering as he anticipated the sacrificial pains that lay ahead for him (Ps 22, 69); how joyfully he sang the psalms of thanksgiving for the many deliverances he experienced (Ps 18, 66, 107, 118, 138); how boldly he sang the psalms of

confidence as he entrusted himself to his heavenly Father (Ps 121, 131); how gladly he sang the psalms of remembrance as he recalled God's great acts in the past (Ps 78, 105, 106, 136); how powerfully he sang the royal psalms especially as he looked forward to his post-cross exaltation and world reign (Ps 2, 20, 21, 24, 45, 47, 72, 110); how righteous he was as he sang psalms that called for harm for Jesus knew of the spiritual devastation his enemies were causing (Ps 58, 59, 109).

Just as certain the psalms did fit the many stages of Jesus' life, they also to fit certain season of our lives.
